



Fukumoto is known as "Uncle Curt" and enjoys creating programs to bring his community to the library. His storytimes are very popular and interactive. In 2017, 4,800 patrons attended Uncle Curt's storytimes and over 12,000 patrons participated in Kāne'ohe programs such as Lego Club, Chess Days, Robotics, Pokémon Go, and more!


